



### "Clérigos by night"

Are you visiting Porto?

Have you ever imagine enjoying the view over the city at night? If so, this invitation is for you. Visit "Clérigos Tower" out of hours!!

Come to know or rediscover Porto at night more than 75 metres high.

The nightly visits to the "Clérigos Tower" take place until the end of the year (December 30, except on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>), from 7:00 p.m. to 11 p.m., and cost 5€ (free for children up to and including 12 years). The ticket also entitles you to visit the church and the museum of the Brotherhood of Clérios.

Since 2015 that the Clérigos Tower and church open their doors at night time, being the first national monument of the city to hold this time.

The purpose of this action is to offer all who visit Porto a "unique experience" in the festive season. But to appreciate the illuminated view from its top of the Porto ex-libris structure where you can also see the scenery in a 360° perspective, you must climb up its 225 steps.




